Dr. Eugene Richardson





Dr. Eugene J. Richardson Jr., World War II Pilot, Tuskegee Airmen, Class 45A. Eugene. was born on September 18, 1925, in Cleveland, Ohio and grew up in Camden NJ. In 1944 Eugene went to Tuskegee, Alabama for pilot training and subsequently received his pilot's wings and officer's commission on March 11, 1945. He served in the Army Air Corps during WWII as a member of the highly respected group, that came to be known as the TUSKEGEE AIRMEN. Dr. Richardson had a dream of flying ever since attending an Ohio air show starring black stunt fliers in the 1930s. When he turned 17, he left his Camden home for Tuskegee University in Alabama, where he completed combat training. A fighter pilot, he was commissioned only two months before the war ended. Eugene takes great pride in the achievements of his fellow Tuskegee men in Europe, where they gunned down 112 enemy aircraft in their signature red-tailed P-47 and P-51 airplanes while providing aerial protection for the bombers flying through the clouds over Germany. After Eugene finished his Military Career he has dedicated his life to education. receiving a science teaching degree from Temple University and later his Doctor of Education degree from Penn State University. Dr. Richardson retired as a Principal from the Philadelphia School District and has worked over the years with several universities. He remains a strong advocate of teaching aviation to high school and college aged men and women.

Dr. Richardson was nominated and elected into the Aviation Hall of Fame of New Jersey in 2021. Due to the museum closures during COVID he is being honored at this time with the four 2022 elected candidates for the Aviation Hall of Fame of New Jersey

Lt Col Edward Ballanco



Lt. Col. Edward Ballanco was born in Hackensack and moved to Montvale where he attended St. Joseph's high school. He graduated from Stevens Institute of Technology. He entered the Air Force in 1972, rising to Lt. Col. Edward was essential in implementing the "Wild Weasel" program during Desert Storm. In addition to combat mission planning, Edward flew 18 F-4G Wild Weasel combat missions, employing the AGM-88 High Speed Anti-Radiation Missile (HARM). He is credited with saving an F-16 from being shot down on the first day of Desert Storm, with a timely HARM shot against an Iragi SAM. Edward was awarded the Association of Old Crows Desert Shield -Desert Storm Award for outstanding contributions in electronic combat and related areas. After the war, Edward compiled and presented the Wild Weasel lessons learned to numerous NATO and US organizations, including the Air Force Chief of Staff, and other senior leaders. In addition, Edward served as the Chief of the Society of Wild Weasels, a non-profit military fraternal organization, established to educate, preserve, and perpetuate the Wild Weasel (WW) Concept - the destruction of hostile electronic emitters, such as the guidance radar for SAM. He was instrumental in preserving the Wild Weasel, history through outreach programs, introduction of data management capabilities and interviews of senior members. He currently serves on the Board as a senior advisor.

Michael Castania



A lifelong resident of New Jersey, Michael F. Castania earns his place among the honored men and women for his ceaseless contributions to education, especially as related to aerospace. Michael taught high school for 35 years, earning himself the educational experience that laid the foundation for his career in Aerospace Education. His love of flying began in 1979 with his private pilot's license. Starting in 1996, Michael joined the Civil Air Patrol and quickly progressed through the ranks to become Lt. Col. Castania. During his 25-year tenure, he has received myriad awards, including but not limited to, the Master Rating in Aerospace Education and Professional Development, Exceptional Service Awards, Meritorious Service Awards, National & Region Commander's Commendations, as well as the National General Jeanne M. Holm Aerospace Education Officer of the Year Award. Michael participated in 5 NER (North East Region). Cadet Glider Academies, co-directed 3 National Flight Academies and has participated in or presented numerous flight seminars, BSA Merit Badge programs, NJ Educational Conventions. He has contracted with school districts and educational programs to bring the joy of flight to students all over New Jersey. Michael has served the people of New Jersey well by continuing to ensure that future generations will have access to opportunities to learn about aerospace by building relationships between organizations, that would not have been possible without his dedication to communication and excellence in education.

Dorothy Johanna Fulton (Slinn)



Dorothy Johanna Fulton was one of the original 28 WAFS, (Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron). Dorothy idolized Amelia Earhart in the 1930s. She was destined to fly and wanted to become a pioneer and heroine for young women. Dorothy attended Teaneck High School and at the age of 15 took her first flying lesson. The school offered the first twoyear Aviation course in the Nation, so she enrolled in it at age 16. She was the second youngest female in New Jersey to achieve the solo private pilots' license, at age 17. Dorothy made National headlines at the age of 19 while taking the school's plane out for a hop, the propeller sheared off. She instantly banked the plane to miss the scything prop. Using her gliding expertise, she landed safely at Teterboro Airport five miles away, demonstrating her skill, courage, and nerve. Dorothy obtained multi-engine and commercial pilots licenses, ground and flight instructor licenses. She taught flying at Teaneck High School and Teterboro Airport before becoming the 22nd member of the WAFS in 1942. In 1943, the WAFS were amalgamated into the newly formed Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP). From 1942-1944 she made many deliveries, often coast to coast, flying single engine PT-19, PT-26, BT-13, and AT-6, the twin-engine A-20, B-25, B-26, C-47, and the high performance pursuit P-38, P-39, P-40, P-47, and P-63. After the war, she had a long and distinguished career as a flight instructor in NJ, NY, and FL. Dorothy passed away in 1985.

William Thomas Watkinson Jr



Born in Pennsylvania, his family moved to New Jersey when Bill was a teenager. William Thomas Watkinson Jr. began his flying career in 1942 and passed the Naval acceptance checkout in 1943. As an acceptance, test, and ferry pilot, he flew every type of single engine navy fighter plane made for the Navy up to 1944. In 1944 he was sent to NAS Melbourne for fighter. gunnery, combat, and night training. From February to April 1945, he was stationed at Pearl Harbor for advanced night fighter and carrier training. In April 1945 Bill joined Combat Air Pool Squadron VF-99 on Guam and Saipan, flying combat missions in F6F Hellcats and F4U Corsair . In May 1945, Bill joined carrier day and night squadrons on the USS Yorktown, flying the F6F Hellcat. One of his last missions was flying combat patrol for the Japanese surrender on the USS Missouri. During the Korean war Bill was a Navy flight instructor at NAS Pensacola, Florida. Bill joined Eastern Airlines in 1950, where he flew until mandatory retirement in 1982. In over 60 years of flying Bill flew over 50 different types of aircraft, (20 military), and accumulated over 32,500 hours including 2000 hours in military aircraft and 16,000 hours in jets. From 2013 to 2020 Bill was a docent on the USS Yorktown, now a museum in Charleston, SC, educating the public on Naval aviation during WWII. Bill passed away in the spring of 2022, at the age of 100.



Aviation Hall of Fame Candidate Qualifications

For All Candidates:

- The candidate must be from New Jersey or must have significant Aviation ties to New Jersey
- The achievement of the candidate must be followed by an ongoing commitment to advance Aviation.

The Candidate should be considered on one (or typically more) of the following criteria:

- Being the first or being a major participant in a significant aviation event
- Be a member of a special or elite aviation group (ie astronaut, test pilot)
- Made a significant contribution to Aviation in New Jersey (ie. Developing or managing an airport in NJ)
- Be the inventor of an aviation-oriented device or system
- Being directly involved with promoting or publicizing Aviation
- Be a leader in aviation education
- Be a significant player in documentation of aviation history (AHOFNJ or any other aviation-oriented organization or facility)
- Be a significant aviation business contributor (ie aircraft building, restoration, ground services, air services etc.)
- Be a significant contributor to Airline/Corporate/Private aviation
- Be a significant contributor to Military aviation

President's Message

After a two-year hiatus of The Aviation Hall of Fame and Museum's induction dinner, a heartfelt welcome to all attending the 47th Induction Dinner and supporting the Museum. Thank You for attending.

Since our 2019 Induction Dinner much has happened that has affected our lives. Covid restrictions forced numerous businesses to cease operating (either temporally, or permanently) and



severely impacted the bottom line of others. The Hall of Fame had to close for four (4) months and then resumed operations on a limited basis. We established a reservation system with three time periods and a maximum of fifteen (15) patrons per period. All mandates and recommendations were adhered to or exceeded, and we sanitized the museum after each period. In March 2021 we lost Junior (Eusebio Camacho), our long-time week-end staff member, to Covid. Additionally, due to Covid and partially to the present economic situation we have lost much of our volunteer staff. Our funding (donations, benefactors, supporters) is just starting to recover, and we are deeply appreciative for all individuals and organization that have continued to support us. Due to the lack of staff, we have reduced the days of operations to Wednesday through Saturdays 10:30 a.m. -4:00 p.m.

During the period since our last dinner, we have added two (2) displays at the Museum. A General Aviation Trainer (GAT) for static display in the "Great Room" and a SGS 2-33 Sailplane (Glider) to the outside display area. The communications module that was located on our military 1952 GMC M211 vehicle has been refurbished and relocated to a platform in the outside display area. The module interior may be viewed from the outside and a radio receiver tuned to TEB tower frequency will be functioning.

In February 2022 our past president, Colonel Stephen Rietohf, passed away and in his honor, we have rededicated (renamed) our auditorium "The Stephen Riethof Learning Center." We are in the process of purchasing and installing a certified Basic Aviation Training Device (BATD) into our Rietohf Learning Center. The training device will be available, for a fee, for pilots and aviation students.

As we move forward our emphasis will be to increase programs related to learning (STEM Based Programs) and encouraging future generations in pursuing a career in Aviation, and/or Aerospace. Our goals is to transition to being an Aviation Learning Center. Again, in closing I want to thank you for your past support and hope that your supporting our goals and Mission will continue for many years. Should you be aware of any corporate programs that encourage employees to volunteer, or that offer grants please let our Director Ralph Villecca know.

Again, let me thank all for the support you have given over the years and in the future.






