Lt. Colonel George Boyd



Lt. Colonel George Mills Boyd was a distinguished military officer and a documented member of the Tuskegee Airmen. He was born in Teaneck, New Jersey and joined the Civil Rights Air Patrol's North Bergen County Squadron where he started a lifelong journey of serving his country and community. George knew he wanted to be in the military and joined the Army Enlisted Reserve Corps that ensured when he was called up, he would report to the Air Corps. He trained at the Tuskegee Institute in Alabama and served as a radar observer and participated in missions that included intercepting Russian bombers near the Distant Early Warning (DEW) Line in Greenland. George served over 28 years in the U.S. Air Force, retiring in 1971 with the rank of Major. His military career and civil contributions stretched over 28 years, and he continued his service in aviation. While serving in the Civil Air Patrol he achieved the grade of Colonel and served as the Director of the Kansas Wing Department. He also was appointed as the Director of Aviation in the state of Kansas. In recognition of his service George received the Congressional Gold Medal in 2007 as a Tuskegee Airman and then a second Congressional Gold Medal in 2014 for his lifetime contributions to the Civil Air Patrol. Throughout his life and career, George faced many obstacles, but he didn't let that stop him. George's life exemplifies dedication to service, resilience in the face of diversity, and the commitment to break racial barriers in both military and civil life. George Boyd passed away on June 21st, 2018 in Wichita, Kansas.

Edwin Havens



Ed Havens graduated from Dumont, NJ High School in 1955, and with a few friends, he joined the United States Air Force. Due to scoring very high on basic training exams, he was pulled out and sent to jet engine school. After finishing school, Ed was based at numerous Air Force bases as a jet engine aircraft mechanic until his honorable discharge in 1959. Ed then attended the Teterboro School of Aeronautics to prepare for his Federal Administration (FAA) license, which he earned in 1961, and was then qualified to work for any US airline, and first joined Eastern Airlines, followed by American Airlines. In 1966, Ed was presented with, what looking back, was an opportunity of a lifetime – to join Flying Tigers Cargo Airline (which was acquired by FedEx in 1989) where he spent the following 34 years working on six continents and 40 countries doing whatever was necessary to keep the flights operating on schedule. After retiring, Ed kept active and in 2009, he joined the New Jersey Aviation Hall of Fame as a volunteer, docent, and President, where he continues to pass on his aviation knowledge and passion for flying to others in the community.

Colonel Joseph Kinego



Joe Kinego moved to Montvale, NJ in 1950 when he was five and lived in the same house through college when he entered the Air Force. Following graduation from Allegheny College as a Distinguished Graduate of Air Force ROTC, he served 27 years in the Air Force and rose to the rank of colonel. He was a Command Pilot with over 4500 hours in the T-38, B-57, RF-4C, SR-71, B-1B, KC-135, and EC-135 aircraft. He flew 148 combat missions in the RF-4C in Southeast Asia and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross for his actions. In 1973 Joe was handpicked for the SR-71 Blackbird special reconnaissance program. He was one of only 86 operational USAF SR-71 pilots in the history of the program, and one of a handful of SR-71 pilots to accrue over 900 flying hours in the jet. He flew over 100 Cold War Special Reconnaissance missions at speeds above Mach 3 and altitudes above 80,000 feet, providing our nation vital intelligence on the Soviet Union, China, North Korea, North Vietnam, and Cuba. He was awarded 14 Air Medals. Col Kinego commanded the 1st Strategic Reconnaissance Squadron flying SR-71 aircraft, and the 319th Bomb Wing flying B-1B and KC-135R aircraft. While commanding the 319th Bomb Wing, he oversaw the safe termination of the wing's nuclear alert commitment at the conclusion of the Cold War. After retirement, Joe made the decision to use his time to educate the public about aviation history. He became a docent at the National Air and Space Museum for six years, and after moving to Florida in 2016, Joe became a docent at the National Naval Aviation Museum in Pensacola, where he continues to lead tours and discussions of aviation history.

Linda Scully



Linda earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from the College of St. Elizabeth where she glanced at planes at Morristown Airport. While on weekend excursions she would drive by "Learn to Fly" signs and this is where her love of flying took off. Linda took an introductory flight for ten dollars at Robbinsville Airport and once that flight ended, she signed up for lessons. Linda earned her private pilot certificate in 1981 and by 1983 she added her instrument rating and commercial certificates. It was then she started instructing at Robbinsville Airport. Linda became affiliated with the Ninety-Nines in 1991 and took up aerobatic flying. She purchased Cessna Aerobat and incorporated Aero Safety Training, Ltd. and started teaching spin awareness, basic aerobatics, and tailwheel transition courses. While teaching this led to the merger of two flight schools Aero Safety Training and Lincoln Park aviation under Linda's ownership. In 1995 with the help of the Ninety-Nines Amelia Earhart Scholarship she earned her ATP rating and in 1999 Linda was the first instructor in the state of New Jersey to earn the designation of Master Instructor. Linda was named Instructor of the Year for the Teterboro FSDO and served as the governor of the New York and New Jersey Section of the Ninety-Nines, NJ Chair Chapter, and was a past president of the Lincoln Park Pilots Association. She was a member of MAPA, National Association of Flight Instructors, Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA), Chapter 501, IMC Program mentor, and the Flight School Association of North America. Linda passed away peacefully but unexpectedly at the age of 70 in her home in Kinnelon, NJ.

Ira Weissman



Ira Weissman has dedicated his career to supporting others, particularly the youth in South Jersey within the field of aviation. His passion for aviation began early, inspired by building model airplanes with an older cousin, leading him to obtain his pilot's license before even securing a driver's license.

Ira served as the first curator of the Air Victory Museum in Lumberton, New Jersey. After being invited to join the Philadelphia Chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen, he took on the role of webmaster and subsequently contributed at the national level as a member of the Tuskegee Airmen's National Strategic Planning Board.

In 2010, under the auspices of the Diocese of Camden, Ira co-founded and currently chairs the Camden Youth Aviation Program now the South Jersey Youth Aviation Program to introduce minority and underprivileged youth to the world of aviation. His commitment also extends to the development of industry standards where he serves on the ASTM Committee developing the guidance for qualifications for EVTOL maintenance personnel and previously contributed to the UAV maintenance personnel qualification standards.

Alongside his wife, Alison, they have served as committee chairs for the Greater Delaware Valley's Girls in Aviation Day for the past three years further promoting aviation education and outreach to expand aviation accessibility to all.

Through his extensive contributions to aerospace education, outreach and community programs, Ira Weissman's exemplary dedication, leadership, organizational skills, initiative and untiring efforts have earned him recognition and respect across the aviation community, reflecting great credit upon himself, the City of Camden and the State of New Jersey.

For All Candidates:

- The candidate must be from New Jersey or must have significant Aviation ties to New Jersey
- The achievement of the candidate must be followed by an ongoing commitment to advance Aviation.

The Candidate should be considered on one (or typically more) of the following criteria:

- Being the first or being a major participant in a significant aviation event
- Be a member of a special or elite aviation group (ie astronaut, test pilot)
- Made a significant contribution to Aviation in New Jersey (ie. Developing or managing an airport in NJ)
- Be the inventor of an aviation-oriented device or system
- Being directly involved with promoting or publicizing Aviation
- Be a leader in aviation education
- Be a significant player in documentation of aviation history (AHOFNJ or any other aviation-oriented organization or facility)
- Be a significant aviation business contributor (ie aircraft building, restoration, ground services, air services etc.)
- Be a significant contributor to Airline/Corporate/Private aviation
- Be a significant contributor to Military aviation

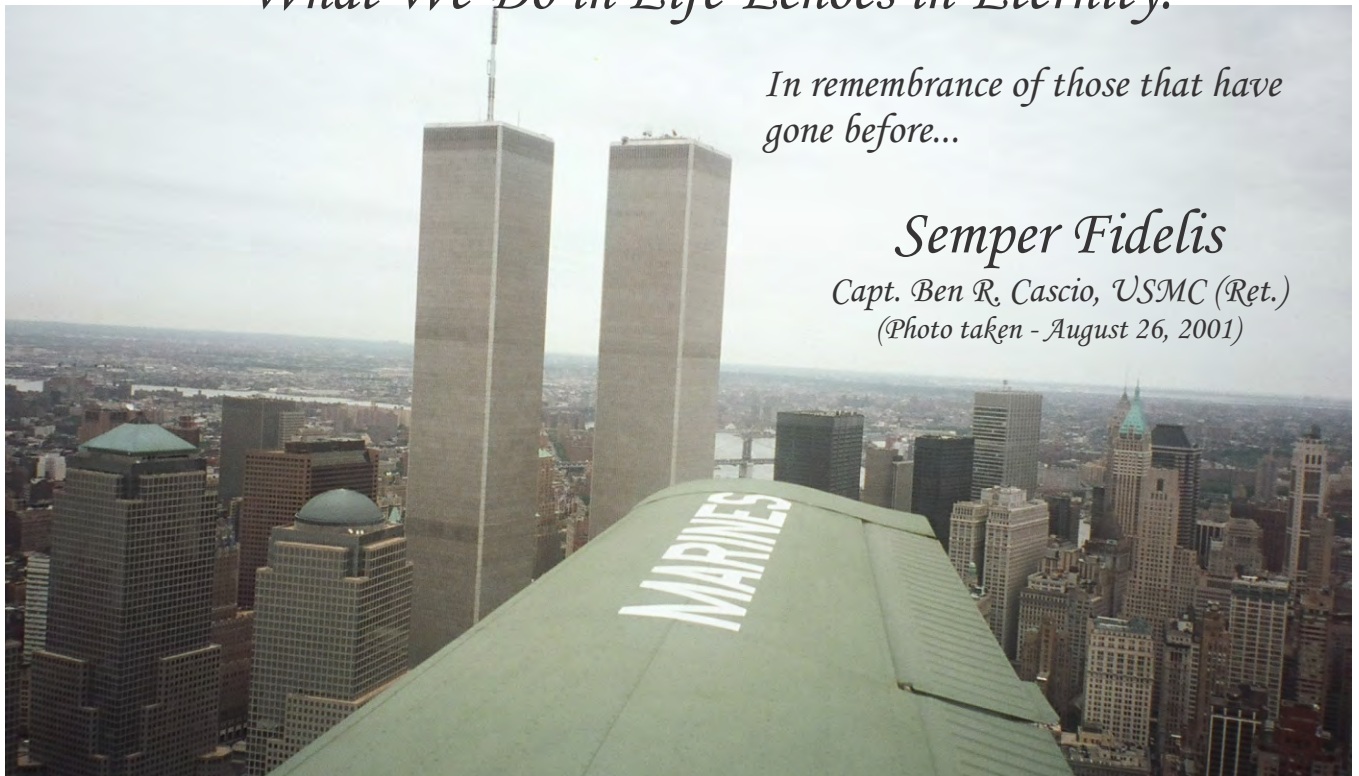

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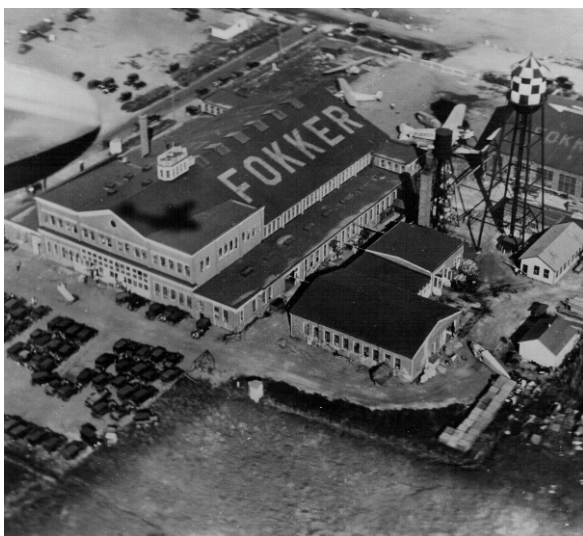

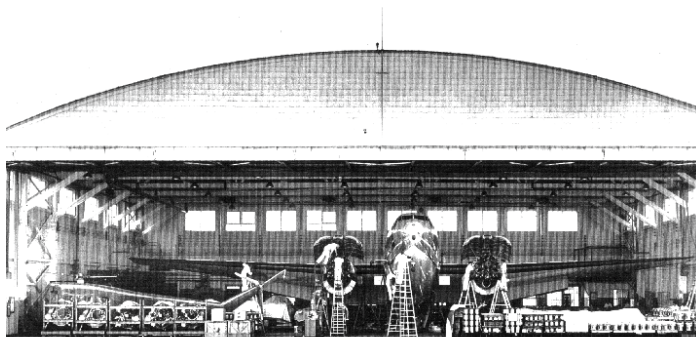
